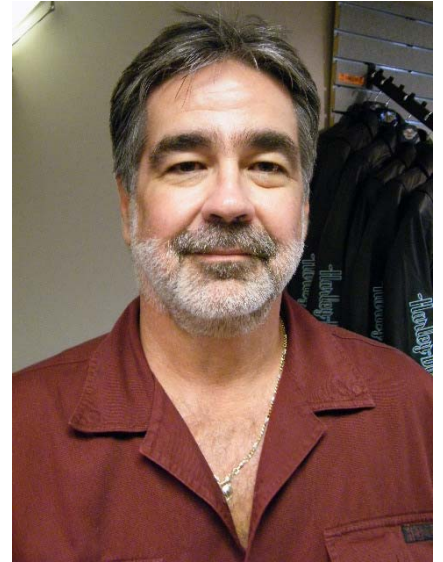

**Ft Lauderdale H.O.G Weekend Ride
35th Annual Reenactment of the
Brooksville Raid**



The 2nd largest reenactment in the state, it encompasses much more than just the battle. The sutler area has lots of "shops" to wander through; after the battle, medical units set up tents, "wounded" soldiers will be brought in on stretchers and typical 19th century medical practices will be performed, including amputations. A lot of it is quite graphic and fairly well done. There are all kinds of food available; there will be several hundred troops, cavalry and artillery and several movements on the battlefield at one time. There are bleacher-type stands set up and the battle is narrated to help spectators understand 19th century battle tactics. There is plenty of "standing room" to see the battle, which takes place in a natural amphitheater. Both Confederate and Federal military camps are open to the public, where reenactors (including HOG members "Major" and Casey Todd) demonstrate 19th century military life and answer questions about the era.

Safety Article:

SEASONED RIDER FACT SHEET

Some crash analysis studies indicate that as the median age for motorcyclists increased in recent years, the rate of involvement in traffic incidents also increased. According to the National Center for Statistics and Analysis of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration fatality rates for riders over 49 years of age increased more than the rates for younger riders. The Seasoned Rider Fact Sheet provides key factors that illuminate the effects of aging on motorcycle operation and motorcycle safety. It is provided in conjunction with the Motorcycle Safety Foundation Rider Education and Training System.

The following data and information was gleaned from reputable sources and applies to operators of motor vehicles in general. Where applicable, motorcycle-specific information is provided.

There are more than 18.9 million licensed drivers in the US who are 70 or older. By 2020, it is estimated there will be more than 30 million licensed drivers age 70 – plus.

One if every three drivers in America is now over 55 years of age. The typical US motorcycle owner is about 41 years old compared with 24 years old in 1980.

The primary traffic violation committed by drivers aged 50 and over is “failure to observe the right-of-way.”

Another common traffic violation committed by drivers aged 50 and over is “improper left turn.”

The effects of aging occur gradually over time and deterioration may not be noticed.

About 20 percent of people age 55 and 30 percent of those over age 65 are hearing impaired.

Recent data show that of the more than 57,000 drivers involved in fatal crashes annually, more than 10,000 of those were over 55 years of age.

The US Food and Drug Administration reported that 50 percent of all medications that older persons take could interact with alcohol. Combining medications and alcohol may cause serious adverse reactions and risky behaviors. Countermeasures that have proven beneficial in reducing the more risky aspects of aging include physical therapy, perceptual therapy, driver education, and modern highway and vehicle engineering.

Rider Functions

Motorcycle operation, as with the operation of any motor vehicle, is a task that involves visual and perceptual functions, cognitive and attention capabilities, and motor skill responses. These human functions are addressed in the MSF program with the acronym of S.E.E. which means search, evaluate, and execute. S.E.E. is a dynamic decision-making process with overlapping functions for maintaining a safety margin. A rider must search for potential crash factors, evaluate the level of risk, and execute a smooth, controlled response in avoiding emergencies. Here are some specific effects and recommendations related to the aging process and S.E.E. that are applicable to seasoned riders.

SEARCH

1. Visual clarity diminishes. This phenomenon is gradual and typically begins between 40-50. Having a periodic eye exam is a wise choice.
2. Night vision is especially diminished. The eyes gather less light as a person ages making it more difficult to see clearly at night. On average, the older person requires four times more light than the younger person.
3. Peripheral vision diminishes. As visual acuity diminishes over the years, the side or peripheral vision becomes blurrier also.
4. Eyes are more sensitive to light. This is particularly true when responding to glare or oncoming headlights.
5. Eyes take longer to adjust from near to far objects and vice versa.

6. Eyes take longer to adjust to dark. The weakened eyes muscles cause the eyes to dilate less quickly.
7. Depth perception diminishes. This may affect judging appropriate gap selection when passing another vehicle and when crossing or turning at an intersection.

EVALUATE

1. Medications affect performance and behavior. Labels should always be read and doctor's advice should be followed.
2. Complicated signage may be confusing. There are many situations, especially in unfamiliar areas, where a rider must contend with several points of information simultaneously.
3. Space and distance are misjudged more frequently. Most riding decisions are based on input from visual processes.
4. Awareness of impending risk is delayed. Eye muscles and body muscles react more slowly, resulting in delayed response time.

EXECUTE

1. Muscles are weaker. Muscle tone and strength deteriorate as a rider ages. Without weight training a person loses 6-10 percent muscle mass per decade starting at age 30.
2. Endurance is diminished. Oxygen is not utilized as efficiently and the muscles lose their elasticity.
3. Reaction time slows. Responding to factors may require more time and space. Reacting to a hazard may take twice as long for a rider who has moved into middle age (40-54 years of age) and up to three or four times longer after age 55 or so.
4. Control sensitivity lessens. The feeling of the road through the tires and handlebars lessens, as well as the feedback that occurs in cornering and braking. This may have serious implications in crash-avoidance maneuvers.

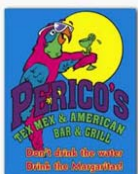

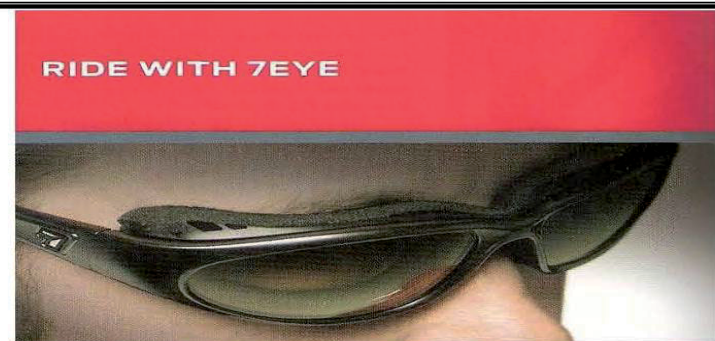

Ft Lauderdale H.O.G Weekend Ride

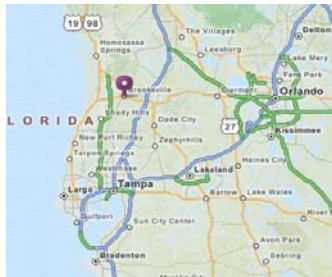
35th Annual Reenactment of the Brooksville Raid



The 2nd largest reenactment in the state, it encompasses much more than just the battle. The sutler area has lots of "shops" to wander through; after the battle, medical units set up tents, "wounded" soldiers will be brought in on stretchers and typical 19th century medical practices will be performed, including amputations. A lot of it is quite graphic and fairly well done. There are all kinds of food available; there will be several hundred troops, cavalry and artillery and several movements on the battlefield at one time. There are bleacher-type stands set up and the battle is narrated to help spectators understand 19th century battle tactics. There is plenty of "standing room" to see the battle, which takes place in a natural amphitheater. Both Confederate and Federal military camps are open to the public, where reenactors (including HOG members "Major" and Casey Todd) demonstrate 19th century military life and answer questions about the era.

IMPORTANT CHAPTER RIDE POLICIES



In the event that inclement weather interferes with our scheduled rides, please be advised of our long-standing policy regarding cancellation of a ride. While it is always a member's option to go on a chapter ride whenever we have inclement weather, a decision will be made by the Lead Road Captain whether the SANCTIONED ride will take place. Riding in inclement weather is a safety issue we should always consider. The formal cancellation of a ride will occur at the time and place the ride begins. The Lead Road Captain running the ride will be present at the designated time and place the ride begins to advise those present of the decision.

While the HOG Ft. Lauderdale Chapter #3343 always promotes riding, we have a responsibility to our members, H.O.G. National, our sponsoring Dealer and Harley-Davidson. All participants in our rides must be a current member of H.O.G. National and our local Chapter. All members are issued a local membership card that must be shown at the time of the ride. If the card is not available, a waiver must be signed prior to the ride. Guests are allowed on up to 3 rides and must sign a waiver prior to each ride. At the 3rd ride, Guests will be asked to become a member. Participants without membership cards or signed waivers will not be allowed to participate in any Chapter events. Guests are not allowed to participate in the fourth event. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
